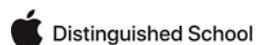

Layton Primary School is a mixed non-denominational Primary School catering for children within the age range 4 years to 11 years. There are three classes in each year group in school. We aim for a maximum class size of 30.

The Aims of the School

- ◇ To develop resourcefulness in all our children. Develop the ability for children to cope in any situation they are faced with in school and in the wider community.

Job Purpose

To work as part of a team, monitoring pupils' behaviour during the midday break.

Key duties:

- ◇ Supervise activities and maintain the health, safety, welfare, good conduct and safeguarding of pupils during the midday break, having regard to special or additional needs.
- ◇ Report incidents in line with school policy.
- ◇ Communicate with pupils and encourage them to select and eat healthy balanced meals.
- ◇ Clean up spillages of food and liquid during meal service
- ◇ Wipe down tables and clean dining areas between meals
- ◇ Carry out routine tasks
- ◇ Follow procedures and instructions
- ◇ Maintain confidentiality and adhere to safeguarding procedures

Individuals in this role may also:

- ◇ Assist in the supervision of other activities during the midday break, including setting out and storing equipment
- ◇ Serve food as and when required
- ◇ Undertake similar work at other times, such as before and after school.
- ◇ Demonstrate own duties to new or less experienced staff
